### CONFLICT BETWEEN THE FIRST AMENDMENT AND TITLE VII EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION CLAIMS TO BE EXPLORED AT APRIL 28th GILMAN LUNCHEON.

The conflict between the First Amendment and hostile environment employment discrimination claims and remedies under Title VII will be the subject of a point/counterpoint at the April 28th Leonard R. Gilman Award Luncheon.

One of the debaters will be Wayne State University Associate Law Professor Kingsley R. Browne who will argue that the current interpretation of Title VII in hostile environment employment discrimination cases runs afoul of existing First Amendment doctrine.

Professor Browne teaches employment discrimination law, employment law and torts at Wayne State and has been a prolific legal writer including articles on the Civil Rights Act of 1991, statistics in employment discrimination cases, comparable worth and preemption, as well as the topic of his presentation. He has also spoken before the ABA and ICLE among others, as well to the media in his areas of expertise. A clerk to Supreme Court Associate Justice Byron White in 1983-84, he was an associate and partner at San Francisco's Morrison & Focrster where he practiced labor and employment law from 1984 until 1989. He came to Wayne State in 1989.

The luncheon will also feature the presentation of the Leonard R Gilman Award to this year's recipient. The Award was established by the Detroit Chapter of the Federal Bar Association in 1985 in memory of Leonard R. Gilman who, at the time of his death on February 12, 1985, was the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Michigan. The award is presented annually at a Chapter Luncheon to "an outstanding practitioner of criminal law" exemplifying the qualities that "Lenny" possessed.
