
ANNUAL DINNER HONORING THE JUDICIARY TO BE HELD MAY 7, 1993

DETROIT CHAPTER LOSES TWO OF ITS EARLY LEADERS

In the past month, two of Detroit Chapter's past presidents, David H. Patton and David A. Goldman, died. David Patton was president of the Detroit Chapter of the Federal Bar Association from 1965 to 1966, and David Goldman was president from 1966 to 1967. Both men were involved in the formation of the FBA Foundation's Rakow Scholarships and both were long time supporters of the FBA.

DAVID PATTON was born in 1912 and grew up in Chicago, Illinois. He earned an A.B.Degree from the University of 11linois in 1937, working summers as a purser on the Great Lakes. He earned a J.D.Degree from the University of Illinois in 1939. During World War II, he served as a lieutenant with Naval Intelligence. He married his wife, Janis, in 1943 and moved to Detroit in 1946. He began practice with the firm that is now Cross Wrock in the area of corporate litigation. He was appointed a judge of the United States Bankruptcy Court in 1965 and served until 1982. Since 1988 he was of counsel to his son's law firm, David D. Patton & Associates. He was active in Detroit and Dearborn civic affairs, the Rotary and was on the board of directors of the National Kidney Foundation of Michigan.

Both gentlemen will be missed.

DAVID GOLDMAN earned a degree speech from Wayne State University. He was a gifted orator and won a large number of debating awards in college during the 1930's. The \$50-\$100.00 prizes enabled him to work his way through college. In 1937, he graduated from Wayne State University Law School. At one time, he taught at Wayne's Law School. David was a commissioner-atlarge of the State Bar of Michigan and was chairman of the Representative Assembly. He was a past president of WSU's Law Alumni Association's Distinguished Alumni Award. He was a practicing attorney for many years and at the time of his death, he was a senior partner with the law firm of Levin, Levin, Garvett & Dill. He loved the power and beauty of the written and spoken word. When he and his wife Harriet, went on cruises, he used to recite poetry on talent night and capture the entire room.

Contributions in their memory are being received by the Detroit Chapter's Foundation.

ASSISTANCE TO VETERAN'S SOUGHT

Ever since Congress created the U.S. Court of Veterans Appeals (CVA) three years ago, veterans have had difficulty finding someone to represent them before the Court: two-thirds of the appellants have had to proceed pro se. A pilot pro bono program has recently been launched by a consortium of our organizations to recruit hundreds of lawyers to volunteer to represent these veterans. The consortium which includes the American Legion. the Disabled American Veterans, the National Veterans Legal Services Project, and the Paralyzed Veterans of America, is screening pro se appeals for financial eligibility and merit. Volunteers will receive comprehensive support services, including training programs, a free copy of the two-volume Veterans Benefits Manual, and, upon referral of the case. a memorandum describing the relevant facts and law presented in the appeal and access to a mentoring attorney. A background in veterans law is not necessary. The program provides pro bono attorneys with an opportunity to obtain appellate litigation experience and repay those who have served our country.
